Scholarship Application Packet Checklist

For more detailed instructions, see pages 27-29.

- Noted the deadlines for submitting my OSAC application and where to send updates to my address and school choice if needed.
- Reviewed the OSAC Scholarship Catalog. (See pages 3-26.)
- Chapter One: Looked for my high school and if I found it wrote, "Chapter One" for scholarship name and "950" for the code in Item 9 of the application.
- Chapter Two: Read each scholarship descriptor carefully to see if I was eligible.
- Chapter Three: Looked for employee and organization membership scholarships.
- Completed the OSAC scholarship application. (eApp or paper application in this booklet)
- Attached the Activities Chart.
- Attached my answers to the four required essay questions.
- Double-checked that I have attached the correct transcript or transcripts.
- Attached additional documents required by specific scholarships.
- Signed, dated, and assembled my application packet.
- Saved a copy of my complete application packet.
- Blackened the first 5 digits of my Social Security Number on all packet documents, except for the application form.



The three main reasons OSAC applications are rejected:

- 1. Missing or incomplete transcripts**
- 2. Missing signature**
- 3. Late application packet**

Catalog Chapters

To help you find programs that match your characteristics, the scholarships are listed in three chapters:

- Chapter One:** Scholarships associated with specific high schools
- Chapter Two:** Scholarships for students of varying ages, abilities, accomplishments, goals
- Chapter Three:** Scholarships sponsored by particular employers or membership organizations

Each program has a toolbar and a descriptor, which lists major eligibility criteria. “Preference” means applicants do not need to meet a particular criteria, but donors prefer those who do.

Important Icons

Merit-based programs (NOT requiring financial need):

◆ The diamond icon before the fund code number indicates scholarships for which financial need is not an eligibility requirement—you can apply for these regardless of whether you filed a *Free Application for Federal Student Aid*, although OSAC always recommends filing the *FAFSA*.

Employer/membership programs:

m The “m” after the fund code number indicates a program available through membership in an association, employment, etc. For these programs, listed in Chapter Three, you must fill out Item 10 of the application.

Extra Documentation:

x The “x” after the fund code number indicates a program that requires extra documentation or essays. Carefully read the description for special instructions. Attach the extra documents or essays to your required application packet. (A few programs require extra documents be submitted directly to a donor committee.)

How to Scan for Scholarships Using the Toolbars

Each scholarship descriptor has its own “toolbar” that identifies the more common eligibility criteria. These toolbars let you use your finger to scan down until you find programs that match your criteria.

For instance, the far left toolbar box tells if a program is open to students from any high school or from specific high schools. (The description then tells if it is limited to graduating seniors or all graduates.) College students scan for the second box—undergraduate programs—or the third box—graduate programs. The far right box shows if a scholarship applies to any college in the US, Oregon colleges only, or specific colleges. Keep in mind the college you are most likely to attend and place that name on Item 4 of your application form.

Any HS: High school graduates or graduating high school seniors

Specific High School: Specific to one high school or group of schools or a single geographic area

Undergrad: For continuing college undergraduate study

Graduate: For graduate study (if not on toolbar, the program is NOT for graduate students)

Part-time: Part-time students are eligible; most of these require at least half-time enrollment

Reapply: You may reapply for this award each year

Renew: You may be able to renew this award for another year or more; instructions will be sent when you first receive the award

Priors: You may apply as a graduating senior; thereafter, only prior recipients may reapply

One time: You may receive this award only once

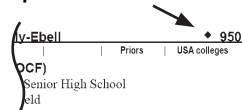
USA colleges: Scholarships for use at any eligible USA college

Oregon colleges: Scholarships only for Oregon colleges

Specific colleges: Scholarships can be used only in selected states, specific colleges, or types of colleges.

Any program without a diamond icon ◆ requires filing a FAFSA

Steps to Scholarship Success

DETERMINE IF YOU WILL FILE AN ELECTRONIC APPLICATION (EAPP) OR SEND IN THE APPLICATION IN THIS BOOKLET.

Online Application: The Fastest Way to Complete an Application—the eApp has a search feature for scholarships and will help ensure you don't miss answering a question!

- Most students complete the application, four short essays and activities chart, online at www.GetCollegeFunds.org.
- Because your transcripts and other documents need to be matched with your application, you will still need to print the eApp, sign it, and mail or hand deliver it with all the required documents. Make sure that you have Adobe Acrobat Reader, which you can download for free, and access to a printer.

Paper application in this booklet:

- Use it as a worksheet to prepare for your eApp.
- If you can't use the eApp, be sure to write neatly and make sure you have completed all the boxes on the application form before submitting your packet.

Complete your FAFSA form online at www.fafsa.ed.gov

- When you complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), you become eligible to apply for many types of financial aid, including scholarships, grants, loans, and work-study.
- Although OSAC merit-based scholarships (marked in the OSAC Scholarship Catalog with diamond icons) do not require you to file a FAFSA, we recommend that you complete the FAFSA regardless of your income.
- You will need an electronic PIN to sign your online FAFSA, and so will your parent or guardian if you are a dependent student. Go to www.pin.ed.gov.
- Complete the FAFSA as soon after January 1 as possible, even if you don't have your taxes done. When you finish your taxes, file a correction by March 15 because that is when OSAC begins determining eligibility for scholarships.
- After you submit your FAFSA, you'll receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). Look over your SAR and make sure it has no reject codes. These codes explain mistakes you might have made when filing your FAFSA. For OSAC need-based scholarships, you must have your reject codes corrected by March 15.

Tips for Submitting Your Scholarship Application

Packet Numbers refer to sections of the Paper Application in this booklet.

1 Identifying information

- Use your legal name. Make sure it is the same name you use when filing your FAFSA.

- Enter your correct Social Security Number. Applicants who do not submit Social Security Numbers may be considered for only merit-based scholarships.
- You have the option of allowing OSAC to text message in addition to email, phone and mail. OSAC will not send you SPAM but only contact you about your application. OSAC can let you know if you have an incorrect transcript or missing document if you apply on or before February 15.
- Contact OSAC if you have any address changes after you submit your application.

2 3 Transcripts

Missing or incomplete transcripts is the No. 1 reason for rejected OSAC applications.

FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY!

- Transcripts must list your name, your school's name, each course taken, grades, grade points, and credit hours. *For security purposes, black out the first 5 numbers of your Social Security Number on your transcript.*
- OSAC does not require official transcripts. Photocopies are acceptable. You can also submit transcripts printed from your high school's or college's website, as long as they include your name, your school's name, each course taken, grades, grade points, and credit hours.
- Grade reports are **not** acceptable for high school or college coursework.
- Summaries of transfer credits from previous schools printed on your current transcript are **not** acceptable, unless they specify individual courses taken and grades received.
- Staple your transcripts to your application. Do not rely on your school to send your transcripts to OSAC.

Decide which of the following fits your circumstances and follow those directions:

Graduating High School Senior

Submit transcripts showing your coursework through the **first semester, second quarter, or first trimester**, depending on your school's calendar, of your senior year. These transcripts are usually available in January or February. Include your SAT or ACT scores if you took those tests.

Home-Schooled Student

If you are not yet enrolled in college, submit:

- A copy of the Confirmation of Enrollment letter on file at your local Educational Service District (ESD)
- A copy of the results of a tenth-grade standardized achievement test, required of all home-schoolers who have registered with their ESD
- Your SAT or ACT scores if you took those tests
- A transcript from your home-school teacher describing your coursework and letter grades assigned

GED Student

If you received a General Education Development (GED) certificate and have never attended college, submit your Transcript of GED Record. Include your SAT or ACT scores if you took those tests.

High School Graduate before 2008, who has not yet attended College

A high school graduate is anyone who is not graduating from high school in 2007-08. You are not required to submit college transcripts. Submit your complete high school transcript or GED score and any available ACT or SAT scores.

College Student

If you completed any college coursework before the start of winter term or spring semester 2008, you are a college student. If you did not, you are a ‘High School Graduate.’”

If you attended college between August 1997 and fall quarter/semester 2007, you must submit transcripts of all college coursework. You may also submit pre-1997 transcripts that demonstrate academic achievement.

If you attended more than one college, submit a transcript for each college, including work on prior degrees.

If you only attended college before 1997, then you must submit either those college transcripts or your high school transcript.

4 College Information

- The college you are most likely to attend determines a number of factors in the scholarship selection process. Some scholarships use your college’s cost of attendance in calculating financial need. Some scholarships are ONLY for students attending Oregon schools.
- If your plans change notify OSAC immediately.

5 – 8 Information that is needed to determine your qualifications for specific scholarships. (Ethnic group is used only for research purposes.)

- Most students who apply will also complete the FAFSA. Your answers should be the same as you gave on the FAFSA. Use the same legal name for both the FAFSA and this application.
- Unless otherwise specified in the individual scholarship descriptions you must:
 - › Be a U.S. citizen or an eligible noncitizen in the United States for other than a temporary purpose, and intend to become a permanent resident of the United States.
 - › Be an Oregon resident for most scholarships. Residency is usually established when an independent student or the parents of a dependent student have been in continuous residency in Oregon for 12 months before enrollment. For exceptions, such as tribal residency, visit [www. GetCollegeFunds.org](http://www.GetCollegeFunds.org).
- U.S. military personnel must have Oregon listed as their home of record.

9 Scholarships for which you qualify

- Follow the Catalog instructions and scan the toolbars or use the search tool on the e-App.
- Make a note of additional documents required by some scholarships. These scholarships are marked with an “X” after the Scholarship Code and may require an additional essay, names of references, proof of relationship, a copy of your birth certificate or passport, or other information.

Experience in Diverse Environments

Some scholarship donors require an extra essay that describes your experience living or working in diverse environments. Such factors may include:

- Socioeconomic or educational disadvantages
- Experience with or commitment to working with historically underserved or underprivileged populations such as members of minority communities
- Being the first generation of a family to attend college
- Living in rural or inner-city areas that might be under-represented on campus

10 Membership/employee information

- Most scholarships in Chapter Three Catalog require you to be a member, an employee, or the dependent or close relative of a member or employee of the sponsoring organization or company. These scholarships are marked with an “m” after the Scholarship Code.

11 Activities Chart

- Focus on activities where you showed leadership, decision-making, and organizational skills, and areas where you received special recognition.
- The eApp will allow you to input your activities so you don’t have to create the chart yourself.

- If you can't use the eApp you can use the template at www.GetCollegeFunds.org/eapp.html or create your own to look like the sample above.
- Keep the chart to one page and put your legal name and your 5-digit OSAC application number at the top.
- Your Activities Chart must include the following three categories:
 - A. School/Family/Community Activities
 - B. Volunteer Service
 - C. Work for Pay
- Under each category, list the following:
 - › Dates you participated (from - to)
 - › Time spent (number of hours per week or month and total hours; don't write "varied"; give best estimate)
 - › Responsibilities or accomplishments associated with each activity

12 Required Short Essay Answers

- Let your essays tell your story. Don't repeat information already included in your application. Show the "unique you" in your essays.
- If you have trouble distinguishing between Question 2 and Question 3, look up "challenge", "obstacle" and "accomplishment" in the dictionary for guidance. These do not have to be dramatic events. How you have responded to events in your life is what's important.
- Do not recreate your Activities Chart when answering Question 4. Focus on highlights.
- Use correct grammar, punctuation, usage, and spelling. When in doubt, check it out!
- The eApp will allow you to input your essays online.
- If you can't use the eApp, create a document and put your name and your 5-digit OSAC application number at the top of each page.
- Pay attention to the topic and length requirements. Each essay should be no more than 150 words.
- Print your essays two per page, double-spaced, on white paper. Use a readable typeface such as Times New Roman, in 10-12 point type size.

13 14 Assemble and Submit your Application Packet

- Even if you completed the eApp online you must print it out, sign it, and attach all documents.
- Applications will only be accepted if:
 - 1) All parts of your application are submitted. Go to the Checklist on page 2 to make sure you have everything and review the requirements for each scholarship you marked in item 9.
 - 2) You have **signed your application**.

- 3) Your application is received or postmarked on or before the deadline.
 - › You can hand deliver your application packet to the OSAC office between 8 am and 5 pm, Monday through Friday, and until 6 pm on February 15 and March 1.
 - › You can mail your application to OSAC with a postmark no later than March 1. Only the U.S. Postal Service postmark date is accepted. The date from a postage meter is not acceptable.
- If you want verification that OSAC received your application, use a service that gives you a return receipt.
- Do not attach photos, letters of recommendation, résumés, or newspaper clippings.
- Assemble your packet in the following order:
 1. Application
 2. Activities Chart
 3. Required Short Answer Essays
 4. Transcripts
 5. Additional essays or documentation

Making Changes to Your Submitted Application

OSAC can accept only one scholarship application per year from each applicant. If you submit more than one scholarship application, OSAC will keep only the one with the latest date.

BEFORE THE MARCH 1 DEADLINE:

- OSAC eApp: Log back in to your online application, make the necessary changes, print it, sign it, write "REVISED" in the upper right corner, and submit it to OSAC by March 1. Remember to keep a copy for your records.
- OSAC paper application: Find the copy of the application you saved for your records, make the necessary changes, sign it, write "REVISED" in the upper right corner, and submit it to OSAC by March 1. Remember to keep a copy for your records.

AFTER THE MARCH 1 DEADLINE:

- Go to www.getcollegefunds.com/eapp.html, and find the quick link for "Scholarship Application Update Form." Fill out the form and submit it as soon as possible.

SCHOLARSHIP NOTIFICATION

- Scholarships are awarded between May 1 and mid-summer. After May 15, visit our website www.getcollegefunds.org/private_awarded.html to find out if a particular scholarship program has been awarded (awardee names are not posted.)
- If you are awarded, you will be contacted directly.
- When all awarding is done, we will place an announcement on our website.

OREGON OPPORTUNITY GRANT (OOG)

Expanded Eligibility and More Funding Available in 2008-09!

OSAC will implement a new methodology, the “Shared Responsibility Model”, for determining student eligibility. The program’s goal is to make postsecondary education not just less expensive but truly affordable for all Oregonians. It will extend the Oregon Opportunity Grant to far more students (higher up the income scale) and increase average awards considerably.

The only application for the OOG program is the FAFSA. Oregon resident students who list an eligible Oregon college or university among their choices to attend will be considered. OSAC determines student eligibility and awards are disbursed to students via their campus financial aid awards.

TARGETED GROUPS

CHAFEE GRANT FOR FORMER FOSTER YOUTH

Federally funded awards are equal to tuition and fees at Oregon public colleges, up to \$5,000. Former foster youth must access funds prior to their 21st birthday. Apply at any time. For eligibility, instructions, and the Chafee ETG application, go to: <http://www.osac.state.or.us/chafeeetv.html>

DECEASED AND DISABLED PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICER GRANT

Available to the natural, adopted, or stepchild of any Oregon public safety officer killed or disabled in the line of duty. Applicants must be Oregon residents planning to attend an Oregon public or nonprofit college. Apply any time.

STUDENT CHILD CARE GRANT

This program formerly administered by the Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS) will be transferred to OSAC in January 2008. Students who have children in daycare may qualify for this grant. Applicants must show need and have filed a FAFSA as well as an additional supplemental application. Priority will be given to students already on the DHS Student Child Care Program waiting list.

Attention high school students!

CAREER GROUPS

BARBER AND HAIRDRESSERS GRANT

Applicants must file the FAFSA and be planning to attend a licensed school of barbering, hair design, cosmetology, or manicure in Oregon.

OREGON NURSING SERVICES PROGRAM

This loan repayment program is available to registered nurses practicing in designated critical nursing shortage areas and specified practice specialties throughout Oregon. Apply online starting in February.

OREGON RURAL HEALTH SERVICES PROGRAM

This loan repayment program is available to physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, pharmacists and dentists practicing in rural health-care shortage areas in Oregon. Participants receive help to repay federal student loans. Apply starting in October.

PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS

JOBS PLUS – INDIVIDUAL EDUCATION ACCOUNTS (IEAs)

Qualify through the JOBS Plus Program, open to clients of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program. Participants and immediate family members can receive funding for future educational expenses through IEAs.

OREGON NATIONAL GUARD

Upon successful enlistment, students will receive up to 90% of tuition costs. The Oregon Military Department determines who is eligible.

OREGON YOUTH CONSERVATION CORPS (OYCC) PROGRAM

Recipients must participate in the OYCC Community Corps program, which provides education, training, and employment opportunities to disadvantaged and at-risk youth ages 16 to 25.
